

# GOD IS NOT THE TRINITY

The Trinity = One God in three persons, or one God in three Gods: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

**“But to us there is but one God, the Father, of whom are all things...”**

*1Corinthians 8:6*

If you have accepted that God is the Trinity, then you are being robbed of the experience of knowing the fullness of God, the riches of His glory, the strength of His Spirit, the full healing of your character, the closeness of Christ, the faith that overcomes, and the height, breadth, length, and depth of the love of Christ. Indeed, our full Christian experience depends upon a right understanding of God and of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We receive grace and peace through knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord:

*“Grace and peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God, and of Jesus our Lord.” 2Peter 1:2*

Wisdom and divine revelation come through this same knowledge:

*“That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him.” Ephesians 1:17*

Even the great promise of eternal life is dependant upon our knowledge of God and of Christ:

*“And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent.” John 17:3*

The teaching of the Trinity interferes with your connection to God by distorting your understanding of God, of His Son, and of His holy Spirit. The fullness that God desires to impart to the believer - of grace, of peace, of wisdom, of divine revelation, and even eternal life - is complicated by this distortion of knowledge.

The concept of a one-in-three God is not explained or stated anywhere in the Bible. Biblical scholars of all denominations candidly admit that the Trinity is an “assumed” doctrine, meaning it is based upon assumption, not on actual biblical evidence.

# WHO IS GOD?

“But to us there is but one God, the Father, of whom are all things...”

1Corinthians 8:6

God = the Father. He is the Source of all things and of all life.

“One God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all.” Ephesians 4:6

“Jesus answered... it is my Father that honoureth me; of whom ye say, that he is your God.” John 8:54

Even though the Bible plainly states that the one God is the Father, the Trinity turns the one God into three Gods - God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. ‘God the Father’ is a title found many times in Scripture. However, ‘God the Son’ and ‘God the Holy Spirit’ are titles that are nowhere to be found anywhere in God’s Word.

# WHO IS CHRIST?

“For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son.”

John 3:16

The Lord Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He is not the Son of the Trinity, nor is He the Son of one of the three Gods that make up the Trinity. No! The Lord Jesus Christ is simply the Son of the one and only true God, whom the Bible identifies as the Father (see John 17:1, 3).

The Lord Jesus Christ is equal with God, His Father, by right of inheritance: He was begotten of God, meaning He came out from God (see John 16:27), therefore He is of the very nature of God possessing all of the characteristics of His Father, and of divinity. It is because of this relationship to God that the Son rightfully bears His Father’s name, being called God and also Jehovah in the Scriptures.

“... as he hath by inheritance obtained a more excellent name...” Hebrews 1:4
